The Fourth of July—also known as Independence Day —has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence. From 1776 to the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades, concerts, gatherings and barbecues. Since the Fourth of July 2021 is on a Sunday; the federal holiday will be observed on Monday, July 5, 2021.

Tree: Apple, Fir, Elm, Cypress





The golf ball technically isn't round. If you look up close, you'll see that the outside of golf balls are filled with dozens of little dimples. This wasn't always the case, but some savvy golfers noticed that older balls with bumps and nicks would travel further. These small imperfections create turbulence in the air surrounding the ball, which helps to reduce drag. Eventually, golf balls were designed with dimples as a way to create turbulence so that balls get more lift and reach greater distances. They are one reason professional players today can hit the ball so much further than players of past generations.





Free Masks


Lavelle Ford and Barbara Spencer are still making masks. Masks are free to all members and to all TMRC residents and staff.
