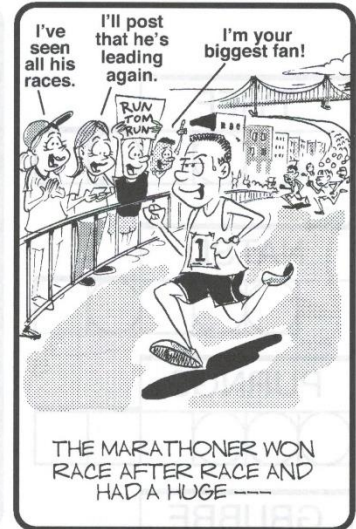
What does Palm Sunday consist of today?

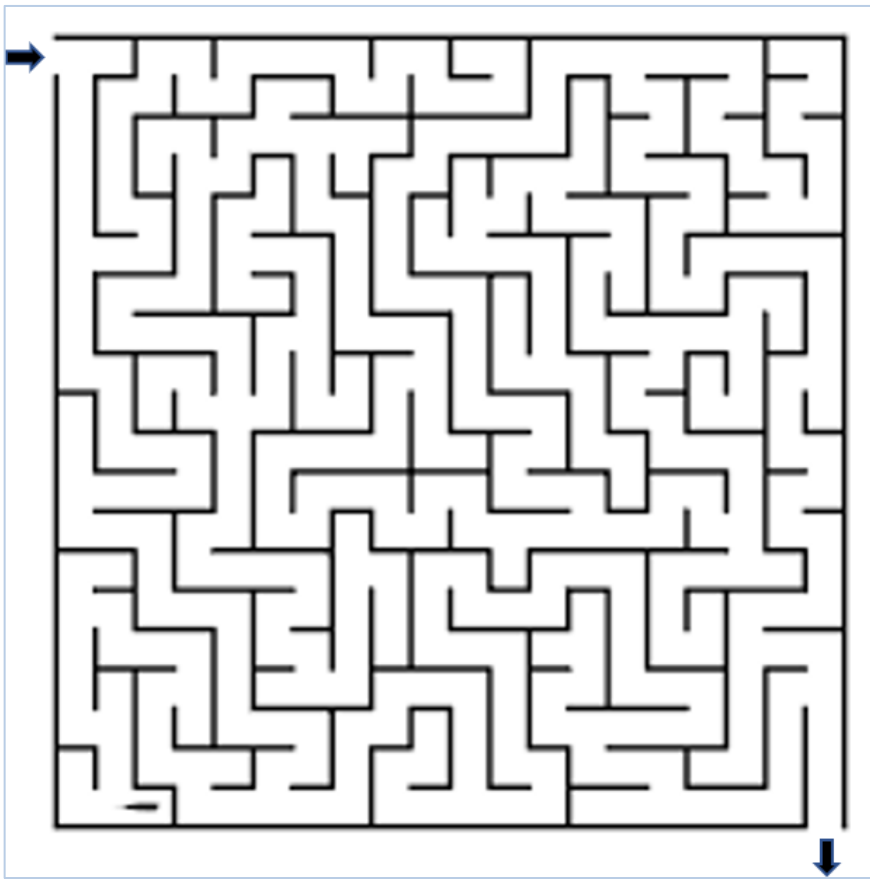

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Passover is celebrated from Sunday, March 28 to Sunday, April 4 in 2021. It commemorates the night of the exodus of the Jewish people from Egypt around 3,400 years ago. According to the Hebrew Scriptures, the angel of death destroyed all the firstborn of Egypt but “passed over” all the Israelite homes protected by the blood of the lamb, which God told the Jewish people to apply to the doorposts and lintels (crossbars) of their homes that night.

The festival thus marks the first and most momentous event in Jewish history. Passover begins with the 15th and ends with the 21st day of the month of Nisan (March or April). On these seven (or eight) days, all leaven, whether in bread or other mixture, is prohibited, and only unleavened bread, called matzo, may be eaten. The matzo symbolizes both the Hebrews’ suffering while in bondage and the haste with which they left Egypt in the course of the Exodus. Passover is also sometimes called the Festival of Unleavened Bread.

“In early Church history, particularly the first two centuries, followers of Jesus commemorated the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ on the same day as Passover. Back then, Easter was known as pascha (Greek for Passover). ... The word Passover comes from the Hebrew “Pesach,” which means “to pass over.”
