**St Patrick day (17<sup>th</sup> of March)**  
was originally celebrated in  
Ireland with religious services  
and feasts in honor of St.  
Patrick, one of Ireland's patron  
saints. When Irish immigrants  
brought St. Patrick's Day  
traditions to the United States,  
the day evolved into a secular  
celebration of Irish culture

Saint Patrick's Day was made an  
official Christian feast day in  
the early 17th century and is  
observed by the Catholic  
Church, the Anglican  
Communion, the Eastern  
Orthodox Church, and the  
Lutheran Church. The day  
commemorates Saint Patrick  
and the arrival of Christianity in  
Ireland, and, by extension,  
celebrates the heritage and  
culture of the Irish in general.  
Celebrations generally involve  
public parades and festivals,  
and the wearing of green attire  
or shamrocks. Christians who  
belong to liturgical  
denominations also attend  
church services and historically  
the Lenten restrictions on  
eating and drinking alcohol were  
lifted for the day, which has  
encouraged and propagated the  
holiday's tradition of alcohol  
consumption.

Saint Patrick's Day, while not a legal holiday in the United States, is nonetheless widely recognized and observed throughout the country as a celebration of Irish and Irish-American culture. Celebrations include prominent displays of the color green, religious observances, numerous parades, and copious consumption of alcohol. The holiday has been celebrated in what is now the U.S. since 1600, with the first parade occurring in 1601.
