Memorial Day - The first Memorial Day (or Decoration Day as it was originally named) was May 30, 1868, a solemn ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery, the former estate of Gen. Robert E. Lee. On that day, Congressman (and later president) James Garfield addressed more than 5,000 families of the fallen. Then, as it is now on Memorial Day, the day is specifically set aside to honor those who died in the service of our nation, though more recent observances include all veterans who are now deceased.

In 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act of 1968, which changed Memorial Day from its traditional May 30 date to the last Monday in May, creating a 3-day "holiday weekend." That significantly diluted the original purpose of this solemn and reverent day. Recent polling indicates that only 28 percent of Americans understand the true meaning of Memorial Day. Many confuse it with Veterans Day (honoring Veterans of all wars, living and deceased) and Armed Forces Day (honoring active duty and reserve military personnel).

The Mint julep is the best refreshing summer drink, made of water, sugar, Bourbon and spearmint. In 19th century, Americans also enjoyed a gin-based julep.

The term "julep" is generally defined as a sweet drink, particularly one used as a vehicle for medicine.
Each year, Churchill Downs serves almost 120,000 mint juleps over the twoday period of the Kentucky Oaks and the Kentucky Derby.
