

The Navy Birthday on October 13 commemorates the day when the United States Navy was founded, in 1775. This day also honors the men and women who serve or served the country in the Navy.


Navy Birthday celebrates the establishment of the Navy branch of the military, and it is not to be confused with Navy Day which is observed on October 27.

On October 13, 1775, that the Continental Congress ordered two sea vessels to be armed to protect the coast and ambush British vessels carrying weapons and supplies for the British Army during the Revolutionary War. In 1794, President George Washington and Congress passed the Naval Act of 1794, which effectively established a permanent standing Navy in the country. (more Navy pg 3)




The Red River Showdown, more commonly called the Red River Shootout, is an American college football rivalry game played annually at the Cotton Bowl stadium in Dallas, Texas, during the State Fair of Texas in October. The participants are the Sooners of the University of Oklahoma in Norman and the Longhorns of the University of Texas at Austin.

There are three Red River Showdown trophies exchanged based on the outcome of the game. The best known is the Golden Hat, which is a gold ten-gallon hat, formerly of bronze. The trophy is kept by the winning school's athletic department until the next year.

A newer trophy, the Red River Rivalry trophy, has been exchanged between the two student governments since 2003. The governor of Texas and governor of Oklahoma also exchange the Governors' trophy and frequently place a bet on the game such as the losing governor having to present a side of beef to the winning governor.


Texas leads the series

The United States Navy(cont'd) is one of the most important branches in the military and the current most powerful naval warfare service in the world. Its fleet grew significantly during World War II with the introduction of submarines and aircraft carriers. Currently, the U.S. Navy has 40 bases around the country, and over 340,000 active troops, with 71,000 in the Reserve.

Navy Birthday was observed on October 27 from 1922 to 1972. In 1972 the date was changed to October 13, as that day is more relevant in the history of the military force.



Columbus Day takes place on the second Monday of October. It is a federal holiday, so most banks and government offices are closed. Schools and post offices do not have to close for the day, some states do not observe the holiday,

Christopher Columbus, born in Italy sometime in 1451, set out on his first exploratory voyage in 1492, with the backing of the King and Queen of Spain. With this voyage, he intended to establish a western sea route to Asian islands near China and India, famed for gold and spices.

On October 12, 1492, the ships landed in the Bahamas. Later in October, they saw the coast of Cuba and Columbus believed he had discovered China. In December, they landed in Hispaniola, thinking it was Japan. There he established Spain's first colony and arrived home in March 1493. He went on to make 3 further journeys in 1493, 1498 and 1502, visiting the islands and the coast of mainland South America. He died in Spain in 1506.
