September (from Latin septem, "seven") was originally the seventh of ten months in the oldest known Roman calendar, with March (Latin Martius) the first month of the year until perhaps as late as 451 BC. After the calendar reform that added January and February to the beginning of the year, September became the ninth month but retained its name. It had 29 days until the Julian reform, which added a day.

Labor Day is an annual holiday to celebrate the achievements of workers. Labor Day has its origins in the labor union movement, specifically the eight-hour day movement, which advocated eight hours for work, eight hours for recreation, and eight hours for rest. In the United States, Labor Day is a federal holiday observed on the first Monday of September. It is customarily viewed as the end of the summer vacation season. Many schools open for the year on the day after Labor Day.

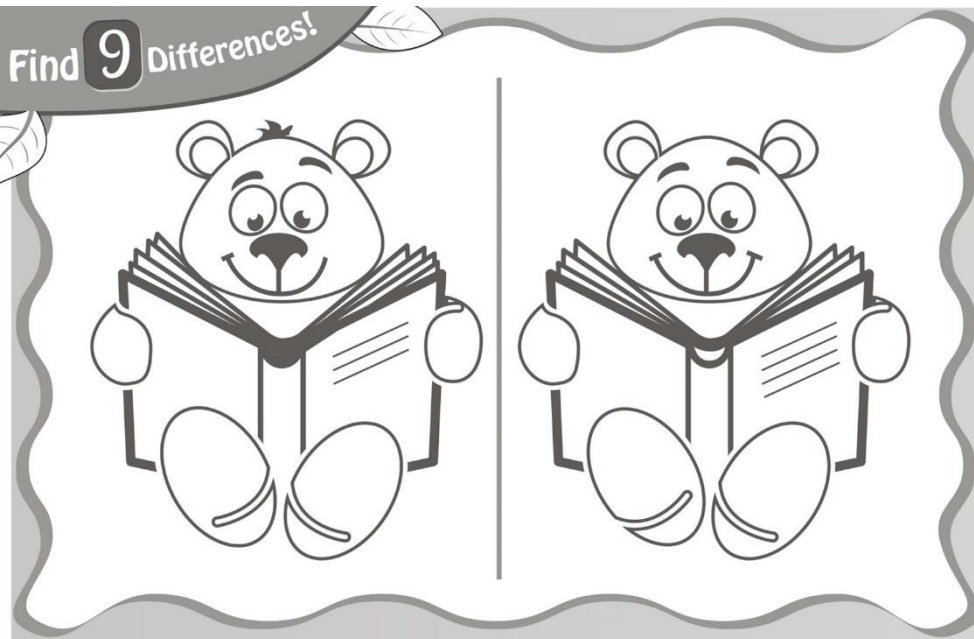

The U.S. toy bears derive their name "Teddy" from President Theodore Roosevelt, who declined to shoot a captured bear cub on a hunting expedition in Mississippi in 1902. Soon after, on November 16, 1902, Clifford Berryman published a caricature of the incident in the Washington Post, which instantly became a classic. Subsequent years have seen numerous teddy bears become famous, such as Rupert Bear, Winnie the Pooh, and Paddington Bear.
